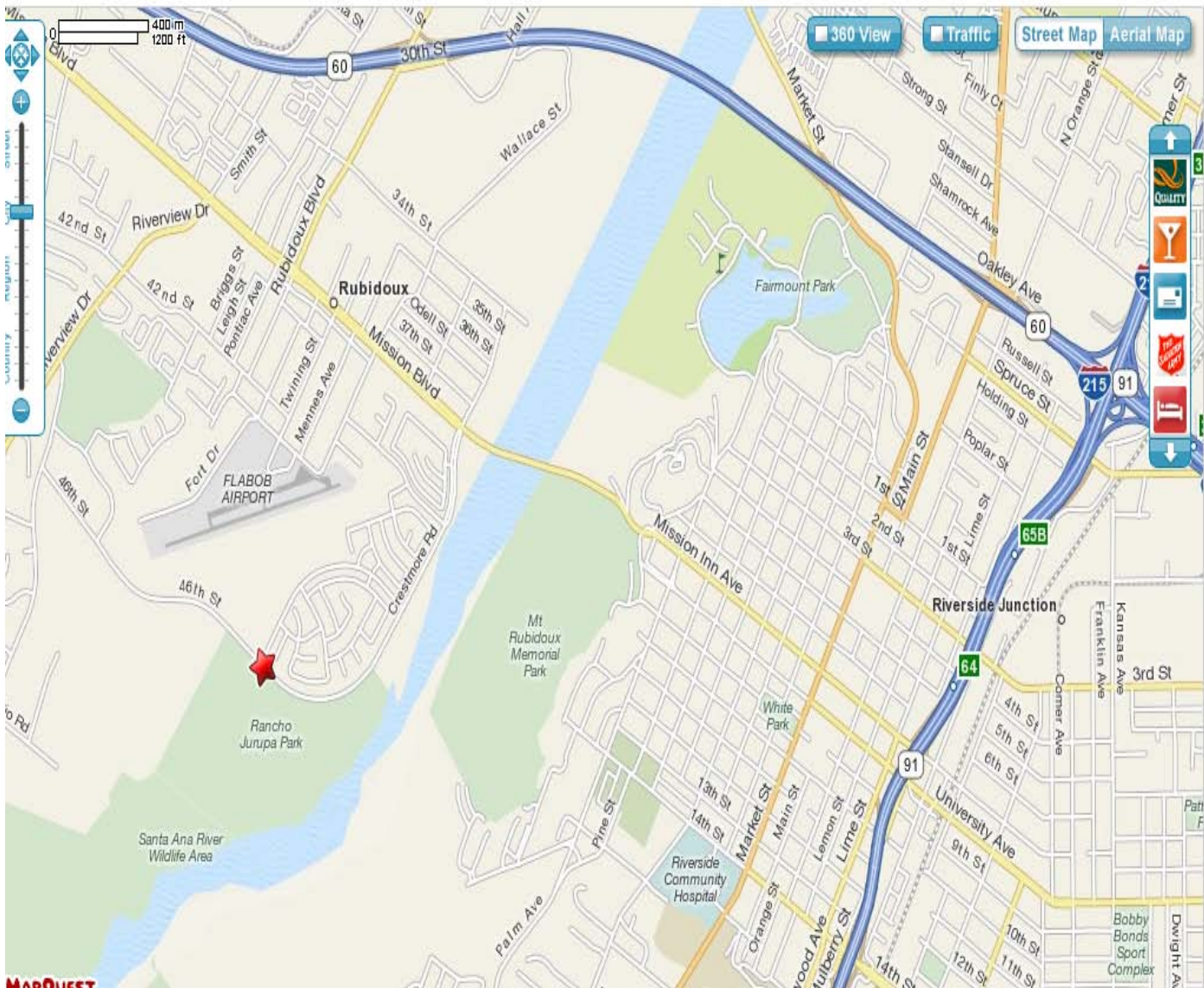

Project status listed below:

### **Santa Ana River Trail Impacts/Closures:**

- Future Closure: City of Riverside's new sewerage line within the Santa Ana Trail Corridor between the Tesquesquite Landfill and the waste treatment plant.
- Current Status: The City of Riverside has submitted easement alignments for the Park District's review and approval.

### **Santa Ana River Trail: (Green River Golf Course to Hwy 71 Bridge)**

- The Orange County Flood Control District and Park District have resolved alignment issues through the Green River Golf Course.
- The Park District has received comments for the Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority regarding permissions to be on their easements and property. The discussions are moving ahead.

### **Santa Ana River Trail: (Hidden Valley)**

- The MOU between the Park District and TLMA has been finalized. Processing to the Board has been delayed by approximately one month due to scheduling conflicts.

### **Santa Ana River Trail: (Corona to Hidden Valley)**

- The consulting team has completed two of the three public workshops. The final workshop is July 21, 2010.
- The consultant is refining alignment issues along several sections of the proposed trail.
- The environmental consultant is completing the required CEQA studies.

### **Jim Real Regional Trail (Bain Street Trail)**

- Easement negotiations with Southern California Gas have been terminated.
- TLMA Transportation developed an alternate route.
- The project was bid in June 2010. The bids were rejected exceeding available funds. The work is expected to rebid in late July 2010.

### **Mockingbird Canyon Trail**

- The consultant is narrowing its alignment selection to a recommended and two alternate trails.
- The consultant is preparing for its second community participation meeting.
- The environmental studies are being completed. The environmental document is being drafted.

### **Wine Country Trails**

- The draft “Design Guidelines” for Rancho California Road in the Wine Country has been completed.

### **Pines to Vines Trail Mapping Effort**

- The Reserve Management sub-committee for trails through the Reserve has met twice since the last report. Design process and route evaluation matrix documents are being drafted. The documents will be presented to the Reserve Management Committee in August.

### **Lake Cahuilla Equestrian Campground**

- Staff is continuing to address problems with the online reservations system for the equestrian camp.

### **Mary Tyo Equestrian Staging Area**

- New access control procedures to make the facility an “equestrian only” facility have been installed.

### **Document/Case Review**

- Case review remains constant with staff reviewing 10-15 projects a week in Western County and 4-8 cases in eastern County.

### **Items of Interest**

- The City of Riverside provided assistance to the Park District by painting over graffiti at Van Buren and Jurupa avenues.
