Learning in a Historic Place

From the 18th to the early 20th century, attending a one room school was normal for rural children. By 1920, half the US population lived in urban areas, (towns with populations of 2500 or more). With the advent of increased urbanization and motor buses one room schools became a thing of the past.

The San Timoteo Schoolhouse opened in 1884 and operated until 1937. Now your students can learn lessons in this building listed on National Register of

Historic Places.





Living History One Room School Adventure

Our living history experience includes lessons in reading, writing, arithmetic, history, deportment and physical activities taught as they would have been in 1905. The lessons are taught by a *Schoolmarm* with a California teaching credential. The program is aimed at 3rd to 6th grade students or students ages 7 to 12.

The School is at 31985 San Timoteo Canyon Rd.: 7 miles from Redlands; 8 miles from Beaumont and 7 miles from Moreno Valley.

The three hour program fee is \$200.00 per group of up to 30 students at a time.

Historic Archaeology Adventure @ the San Timoteo School Site

With our Historic Archaeology Adventure, students will use primary historic records and the data they develop, from an Archaeological Surface Survey to create a better understanding of a child's life 100 years ago Students will discover and use real 100 year archaeological artifacts.

The three hour program fee is \$200.00 per group of up to 32 students time.
